Novated Leasing – How does it work?

Novated leasing celebrated its 35th birthday in 2021. However 2022 turned out to be a more significant year when the Electric Car Discount Bill was introduced to make EVs, and PHEVs exempt from FBT. The move is designed to encourage the transition to low and zero emission vehicles in businesses and because of the way novated leasing works, it significantly changed the benefits and savings available when you salary package an electric car.

Salary packaging saves you money

When you participate in salary packaging, you're paying for items from your pre-tax salary. This reduces your taxable income and the amount of tax you pay – putting more in your pocket each month!

When you salary package a car it's also called novated leasing. With a novated lease, most people can save money when buying a new car compared to using cash or a redraw from their home loan. It may sound complicated, though once you do some research you'll be amazed at how much you can save.

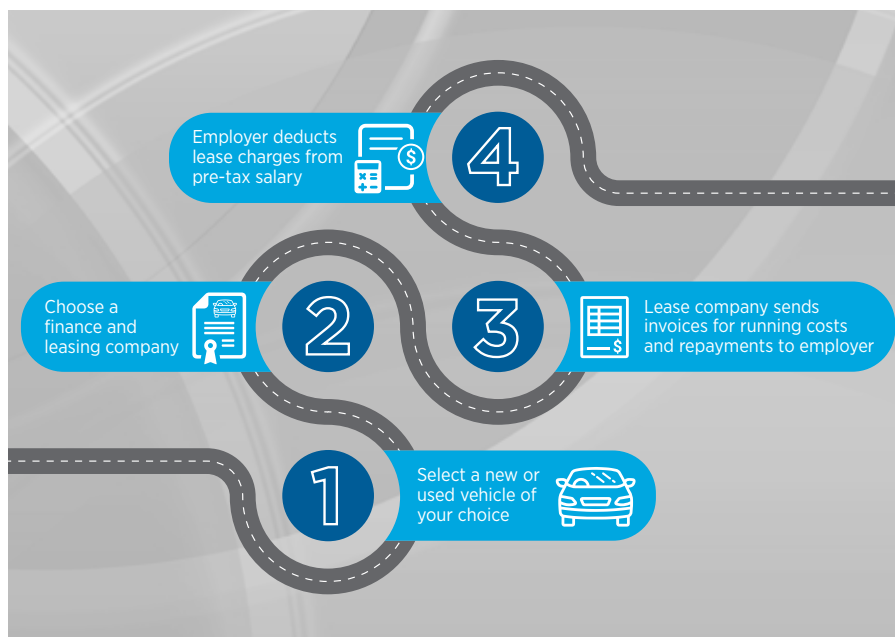
Why is it called a novated lease?

Novated is a fancy term that is popular in legal circles. It refers to the tri-party arrangement between you, your employer and the leasing company. It's also called salary packaging because you are including the purchase and running costs of a car in your total remuneration package.

What's included in the monthly rental?

Everything! The figure looks high at first because it includes fuel, maintenance, tyres, depreciation, annual rego, insurance and the finance costs. It's like a budget so when the rego is due, or a major service, you'll have the money ready and won't suffer from financial anxiety.

While the monthly rental is important, the main thing to look at is the amount of money that will hit your bank account each payday. The 'out of pocket expense' will be less compared



to using cash or another finance method to buy a new car. For some people, they get a new car and pay rise.

Can I source my own car?

Yes. The supply of new cars was tight in 2023 and some models are still hard to get. If you know the car you want and can find one, the novated leasing company will be able to arrange everything else. With long wait times on some models, this may be the fastest way to get a new car in 2024.

Can I lease a second-hand car?

Yes. You'll need to check with your company and the preferred provider because there may be limits on age or kilometres. You can even use your

existing car and get the benefits of salary packaging.

What happens at the end of a novated lease?

There are three options:

- 1 Sell the car privately and pay the residual value. (A great way to get into a new car and maximise the sale value of your old car.)
- 2 Pay out the residual value and keep the car. (If you love it, why not keep it?)
- 3 Pick a new car and get the dealer to take your old car as a trade-in. (This is the easiest option though you'll still need to pay out the residual value on the lease.)

Thinking of – *buying a new car?*

Are you planning to buy a car with cash or finance?

Did you know that you could end up with more dollars in your pocket with a novated lease compared to buying it with cash or regular finance?

Using normal finance you pay from your salary after tax. With a novated lease you salary package the car and make the payments before tax.

The alternative is to wait until you can save enough cash for the car you want. But saving is hard. Expenses always eat into your precious savings which means you'll need to wait longer for a new set of wheels.

All you need to do to take advantage of this legal (and easy) way of reducing your tax bill is to work for a company that offers salary packaging as an employee benefit. If it's not currently available then ask about setting it up so you can access the savings.

What's the difference between owning a car and a novated lease?

The first thing is the running costs are paid from your salary before the tax is taken out. This reduces your income which also reduces the tax you pay.

What do we mean by running costs?

Well, the obvious one is fuel. You also have servicing, finance costs and insurance. When they are included in the lease, the financier claims the GST input tax credit which is like you getting a **10 percent discount**. And with a novated lease all the expenses are combined into one monthly rental which makes budgeting easier.

When's the best time to buy a new car?

The last weekend of the month is a great time. Car dealerships have targets to hit and the end of the month is a great time to do a deal. Not every dealer will play the game so shop around to get the best price.

Another good time is at the start of the year. Manufacturers often provide incentives to sell the cars that were built in the previous year.



Buy the top model in the range

With a novated lease you pay a monthly rental depending on the length of the lease (36, 48 or 60 months) so the cost for a model upgrade is spread across the term of the lease so you can enjoy the luxury without the upfront payment.

Can I get an electric car in my novated lease?

Yes! The Federal Government introduced a new policy in 2022 to encourage more businesses to add electric cars to their fleets. The benefits also apply to a novated lease. There's more details in the section on electric vehicles so take the time to find out more.

What is FBT?

You may not be an accountant, but you need to know about Fringe Benefits Tax and how it applies to a novated lease.

FBT applies to many non-cash benefits an employee gets from their employer, such as entertainment, living-away-from-home expenses, and the private use of a company-owned car.

The Australian Tax Office says that "a benefit" arises when a work vehicle is used for private travel by an employee.

You'll be using your novated lease vehicle for private trips (because that's what we do with cars) so you'll be getting "a benefit" which will attract FBT.

If you start talking about FBT everyone's either an expert, or an ostrich with their head in the sand. That's because the calculation sounds complicated and varied depending on the type of organisation you work in.

When you get a novated lease you can pick the car you really want and it's also the right time to make it look great with some accessories.

These days there's a long list of genuine accessories from the dealership which will be covered by the manufacturer's warranty and have been engineered specifically for your car. There'll also be a range of aftermarket options.

The great thing about including accessories in a lease is the way the cost is spread over the lease term. For example, an accessory that costs \$720 is only \$20 a month over three years. Then after tax, it's even less!

So, don't skimp on the accessories and load up your car with all the things that will make it practical and fun.

Metallic paint

The colour of your car is as important as the brand you choose. Don't skimp on this.

Interior

Go for leather. The smell. The feel. It's a small price to pay for luxury.

Roof racks

It's amazing how useful these can be. Think about the look as well as the practicality.

Window tint

It should be a standard feature. Not only does it look great it keeps your car cool.

Tyres

Stick to a quality brand or the manufacturer's recommendation. Remember - there's only one hand print between you and the road.

Safety pack

If you're buying a family car then tick every option. Even if you're not, the safety features hold their value when it's time to sell.

New wheels

Create a unique look with a different set of wheels.

Tow bar

If there's a chance you might tow something one day (or even use a bike rack), get it fitted at the start.

Residual Value

The amount that you will need to pay at the end of the lease term.

Monthly Rental including FBT

This is the monthly amount that you would pay before tax with a novated lease. It includes the finance component and a budget for all the vehicle's running costs. i.e. Fuel, maintenance, tyres, insurance, registration and Fringe Benefits Tax (FBT).

Estimated Annual Savings After Tax

This is the estimated financial benefit of a novated lease compared to owing and financing the car yourself from post-tax salary.

Annual FBT

This is the amount of FBT that's included in your novated lease monthly rental. Refer to pages 3 and 23 for more information on FBT.

Electric Vehicles – *and hybrids*

What does an electric car drive like?

They are lots of fun. Acceleration is great. The ride is smooth and quiet. It does take a few trips to adjust your driving style because of the regenerative braking. Once you've driven one you'll start planning the changeover from your petrol/diesel car because they are so good.

FBT – what's all the fuss?

Fringe Benefits Tax has been around as long as novated leasing. It's something that causes confusion and frustration due to its complexity, and often scares people away from the financial benefits of salary packaging. Put simply, in a novated lease you'll pay 20% of the car's purchase price as FBT each year. Even with this added expense, most people still save money with a novated lease compared to buying a car with cash.

In 2022 everything changed for FBT and electric cars. The Federal Government introduced the Electric Car Discount bill which provides an exemption on FBT for electric vehicles (EVs) and plug-in hybrid vehicles (PHEVs). This means you do not need to pay 20% of the purchase price each year as FBT if you purchase an EV or PHEV in your novated lease. The FBT is still reportable (which may have implications for some people), but it's no longer a financial cost.

This makes electric cars accessible to more people via novated leasing

because the monthly cost is significantly reduced. As a result, demand for electric vehicles has dramatically increased.

You don't need to be an expert in FBT to understand the benefits. Just look through the pages of this guide to compare one of several models that are available as petrol or electric. You'll see a significant difference in the purchase price with a small difference in monthly rental. Or compare the monthly rental of a petrol powered car and an electric car with a similar purchase price.

Electric Car Discount Bill

This is the legislation introduced by the Labour Federal Government in 2022 to make low emission cars exempt from Fringe Benefit Tax (FBT). It applies to electric vehicles (EV) and plug-in hybrids (PHEV). It is meant to encourage companies to adopt more electric vehicles into their fleets.

It also applies to novated leases which means you don't need to pay FBT if you salary package an EV or PHEV. This can save you thousands of dollars and if you plan to make your next car electric.

For example, if you lease a Hyundai Kona Highlander petrol model, you'll pay \$7,660 in FBT. If you lease the electric model, you pay zero FBT. Like all Government policies, there is some fine print so make sure you ask some more questions when getting a quote.

Can an EV tow a boat or caravan?

Yes, the Hyundai IONIQ 5 and the Kia EV6 have a towing capacity of 1,600 kg when using trailer brakes. Not all electric vehicles are designed to tow trailers though technology is improving each year and each generation of EVs gets more capable. And just like a petrol or diesel car, the more load you carry the more fuel you burn.

Hybrids – *A stepping stone to an electric car*

Hybrids have been around since the nineties however it's only recently that new car buyers realised the benefits of lower fuel consumption and reduced CO₂ emissions. If you're not ready for an electric car, a hybrid is the next best thing while pump prices continue to remain high.



A hybrid uses both petrol and electric motors to provide power to the wheels. There is a battery to power the electric motor which is charged by the petrol engine when not being used. The engine management system decides when to use the electric motor (normally at low speeds or when accelerating) and when to use the petrol motor.

You still fill the car with petrol and there's no need to charge the battery separately. The range isn't limited like an EV because you fill up at any petrol station which makes it perfect for driving holidays, or families with lots of weekday activities.

By combining the two technologies (petrol and electric), a hybrid system delivers lower fuel consumption to save you money which is the main reason people choose a hybrid car or SUV for their novated lease.

Plug-in hybrids (PHEV) – How do they work?

A Plug-in Hybrid Vehicle (PHEV) looks complicated because it has an external charging port similar to an electric car. However, it's more like a traditional vehicle which can be filled with petrol and driven like a petrol powered car. They do come with a battery that is recharged by the petrol engine while driving, or it can be recharged by plugging it into a power point.

What makes a PHEV different to a traditional hybrid is the larger battery size, and the ability to charge it externally. The larger battery lets you drive longer

in EV mode which improves the driving experience and reduces CO₂ emissions on your daily commute.

The size of PHEV batteries has been increasing and the latest generation Mitsubishi Outlander can now drive more than 80 kilometres when fully charged. If you're like most people, this will allow you to drive to work and back in EV mode and then recharge overnight using off-peak power. It will give you an electric vehicle ownership experience with

the flexibility of a petrol tank when you want to take a longer trip.

If you don't charge the battery externally, the petrol engine will charge the battery when it has spare capacity. The engine management system will also use regenerative braking to return energy to the battery when you slow down. This is how a traditional hybrid car works to achieve lower fuel consumption than a non-hybrid car which saves you money at the pump. And PHEVs give you the same benefit.



EV v ICE – novated leasing levels the playing field

Novated leasing has always been a great way to own a new car without needing to save a large amount of cash to make the purchase. Now electric vehicles, thanks to the Electric Car Discount Bill which gives EVs and PHEVs an exemption from FBT, make more sense in a salary packaging arrangement despite the high purchase price.

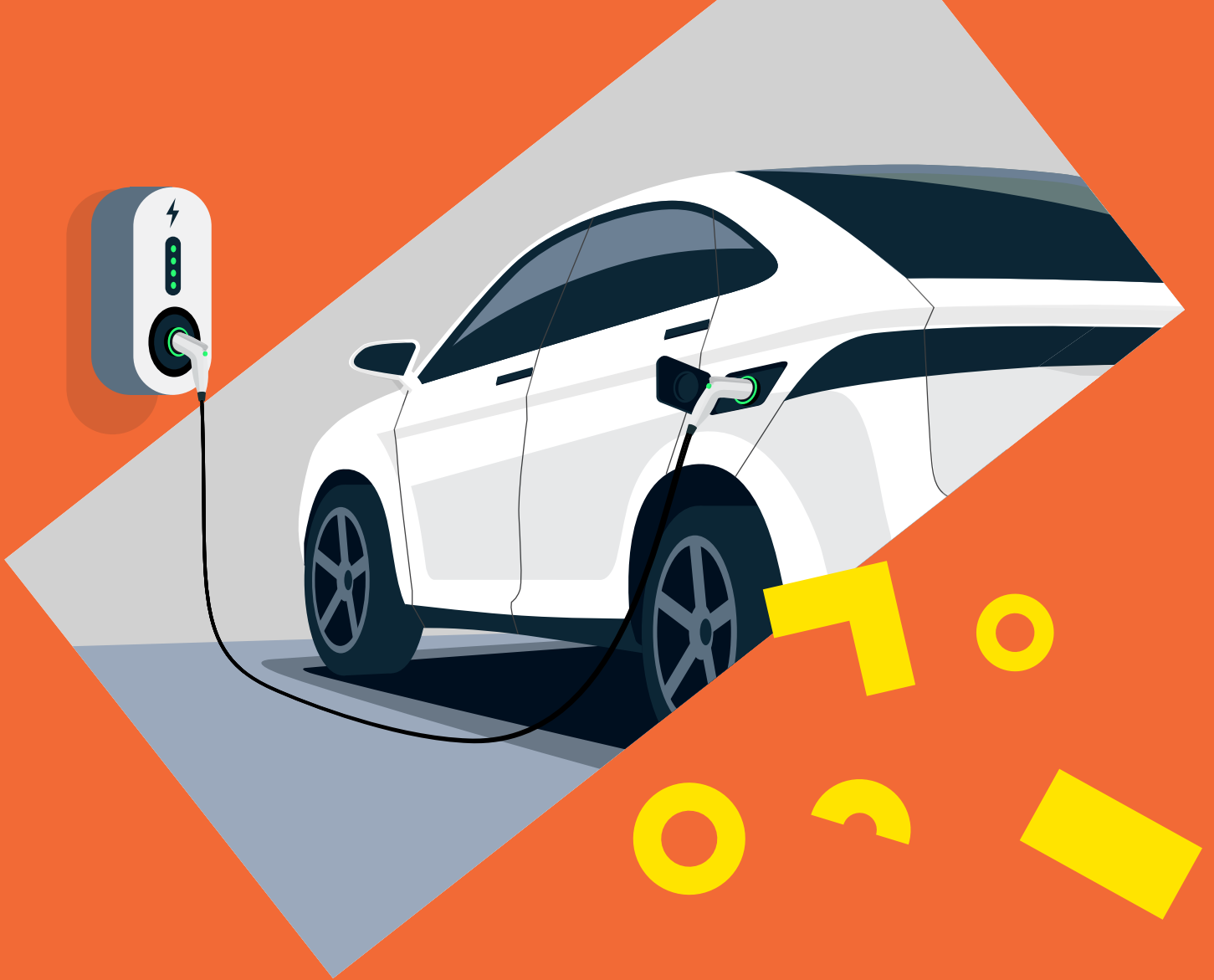
Electric and PHEVs have been made exempt from FBT by the Federal Government to encourage fast adoption and to help reduce the carbon emissions from transport. The FBT is a huge component of a novated lease repayment so without it, the savings are significant.

In the table below you can see the significant difference in Manufacturer's List Price for the petrol version of the Peugeot 2008 SUV compared to the electric e-2008. This is the number one reason people don't consider purchasing an electric vehicle when looking for a new car.

When comparing the Peugeot e-2008 to the petrol 2008 in a novated lease, the higher purchase price of an electric vehicle is no longer a factor in the consideration of which powertrain to buy because the Out of Pocket cost is lower when there's no FBT to pay. This is making electric cars more accessible to more people and helping employees reduce their environmental footprint.

EV charging – *Everything you need to know*

If there's a power point where you regularly park your car, you're ready for an EV. It may not be the fastest way to charge an electric car, but it's the simplest (and cheapest) method to use when your car is parked for 8-12 hours overnight.

For a quicker charge at home, you can install a Level 2 slow charger that will give you 7kW and significantly reduce your charging time. This is suitable for most EV owners and can be installed without a significant cost in most dwellings. A 22kW Level 2 fast charger is another option at home if you have access to three-phase power.

Before you decide on the best charging solution for your new EV, you should take some time to understand your driving patterns. For someone that travels a short distance to work and parks in the same spot every night, a Level 1 charger will do the job. If you travel 100km or more each day, a Level 2 fast charger at home might be the best solution.

It's important to remember that bigger is not always better with EV charging. Fast chargers may be quicker, but they cost more and could have a long term impact on the battery's condition over the long term. All the experts recommend to charge slowly when possible.

Public networks are the other option for EV charging and there are more

locations being added every month. In most shopping centres you'll find a free 22kW charger but be prepared to wait. For a fast charge you'll need to pay for anything more than 50kW. Payments are quick and easy via an app though you might end up with several apps on your phone until you work out which location suits your routine.

Ev charging – should I use a public charging network or charge at home?

It can take several months to develop a charging routine when your new EV arrives. The easiest way to charge is

with an EV charger installed at home so you can charge it whenever you're parked in the driveway. But what if you don't have access to a driveway? Then you'll need to rely on public charging networks which are perfect for EV owners with a novated lease.

The thought of using a public charging network might send shivers down your spine after hearing the horror stories from the early days. Though times have changed. Once it became clear that electric vehicles weren't going away, governments started building, and funding, charging stations in shopping centres and other key locations. This has improved the public charging experience and created larger, more reliable networks.

Now, there are several types of public chargers. The free ones are good for a top up and most people start with these until they work out their routine. However, they are normally busy with caps on the charging speed and capacity so it will be hard to achieve a full charge. After a few months most EV owners work out a charging routine that involves free top ups when available, and fast charging using a public network to get a full battery.






If you want fast public charging (50kW or more), you will need to pay. How much you pay will vary by supplier, charging speed and location. In 2023 the average cost for a 50kW charging was \$0.50 per kilowatt and the faster the charger, the more you pay.

However with a novated lease, your actual cost isn't \$0.50 per kWh. The GST is claimed by the provider of novated leasing which reduces the cost to approximately \$0.45. Then when you pay with pre-tax contributions, the cost per kWh is reduced depending on your income. For someone earning between \$45,001 and \$120,000 per annum (FY23/24), the cost will reduce to approximately \$0.30 per kWh which is similar to the price you pay at home.

So while public networks might not be part of your initial EV charging plan, the cost and convenience might work out better than installing an EV charger at home.

How much does it cost to charge an EV?

It's free if you're using solar power. Otherwise, the cost per kilowatt hour (kWh) varies per state and is different for each electricity retailer.

Some households will pay more at peak times and less during the non-peak periods. So you'll need to check your electricity bill to find the cost per kWh.

Once you have the cost per kWh, you can multiply it by the size of the battery in your EV. For example, a 70 kWh battery (@ \$0.30 per kWh) will cost \$21 to recharge.

If you want to use a public EV fast charger (i.e. 50 kW or higher), you'll pay \$0.50 kWh or more for the convenience of speed. The market is still evolving with limited competition so prices have remained stable. Though with more public charging sites being built each month, and more electric vehicles on the road, increased availability should generate some price competition to make it cheaper to charge faster.

One of the benefits of novated leasing is the savings from pre-tax payments. This means the \$0.50 kWh being advertised as the price to charge isn't what you'll pay with a novated lease. It will be closer to \$0.30 kWh which is a 40% saving. Why? The leasing provider will claim the GST (approximately \$0.05) and then you'll pay from pre-tax dollars which delivers the additional discount.

BYO EV charging cable

A charging cable to access public networks is the must have accessory for EV owners. It's an important option to tick when ordering your new novated lease so it can be included in the purchase price like floor mats and window tint.



Fast DC chargers (50kW or more) will have dedicated cables but if you plan on using the free AC chargers available at most shopping centres and carparks, you'll need your own cable. Even if the charger has a cable available it may not be the right one for your car so it's best to be prepared.

How much will you pay to travel 100 kilometres?

The electric vehicles on sale in Australia consume between 10-25 kWh/100km. The kWh/100km will decline over time as the next generation of electric vehicles become more efficient and require less power.

A small car will use less electricity than a large SUV, which is how it works for Internal Combustion Engine (ICE) vehicles today.

Here's a comparison of the cost to travel 100 km in an electric Hyundai Kona compared to the petrol model.

Electric Vehicles – *coming in 2024*

There are some exciting electric cars coming in 2024 that will become popular novated lease vehicles if there's enough supply to meet the demand. Here's the ones we're getting excited about.



Hyundai Kona

When Hyundai launched the previous model Kona electric it was an instant hit with fleet buyers because it looked like the petrol version. The latest version of the Kona was released in 2023 and the electric version was launched at the start of 2024. With competitive pricing, roomy interior and great exterior styling, the Kona EV should be a popular novated lease car.



Kia EV5

The Kia EV5 will be available in early 2024 as a medium SUV built on the latest generation E-GMP dedicated EV platform. It looks like a smaller version of the EV9 which wowed new car buyers when released in 2023. As a medium sized SUV, the EV5 will compete against the top selling Tesla Model Y. Initial indications suggest pricing will meet market expectations and provide another SUV option for novated lease buyers.



Subaru Solterra

Subaru opened the order books for the all new Solterra late in 2023. The Solterra SUV not only marks the debut of a Subaru battery electric vehicle in Australia, but also represents the beginning of increased diversification in the Subaru model line-up that will include additional Hybrid and EV models in the future.



Toyota bZ4X

The bZ4X is the first Toyota EV to be launched in Australia and is expected in dealerships during the first quarter of 2024. Pricing and specifications weren't available at the time of publishing so it will be interesting to see where Toyota positions this car. No doubt novated lease buyers will be attracted to Toyota's reliability and strong resale which will make this one of the hottest new releases in 2024.



Polestar 3

Probably priced above the average novated lease electric car but it shouldn't stop the excitement building as the first deliveries of the all-new Polestar 3 get closer in 2024. It will come with a 111kWh battery pack to provide a range of 600+ and feature the latest technological developments from Polestar to make it a benchmark for driving excellence and sustainability.



Volkswagen ID.Buzz

There are several Volkswagen electric cars to be excited about in 2024. They have promised five new EVs by 2025 with three medium SUVs (ID.3, ID.4 and ID.5), the ID.Buzz people mover (our pick) and the ID.Buzz Cargo. All five vehicles look fantastic and if available in any significant volume they'll be a hit with novated lease buyers.



Peugeot E-208

The 208 is an iconic model in the Peugeot range and now it's taking on a whole new dimension as an electric car. The new E-208 is a dynamic, modern, and highly alluring city car that we believe will capture the attention of many novated lease buyers looking for some European chic.
